NRP funds survey results

over the last few months, BNA surveyed residents and businesses about how to allocate the Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP) funds recently released by the City. The two topics that rose to the top were home improvement loans/grants and supporting our neighborhood schools.

In order to move forward with new home improvement programming, we need to make a slight addition to the wording of an NRP strategy at the February meeting. In accordance with NRP rules, BNA is giving broad notice of the strategy and proposed additional wording (added wording is underlined):

"Establish a home improvement revolving loan/grant program for Bancroft residents."

The first program being implemented is a Curb Appeal Lottery. The finer details are still being ironed out, but the program will allow residents to improve the façade (meaning visible from the street) of their home with a percentage of the cost being granted by BNA. Specific program details will be discussed at the Annual Meeting on February 8, as well as in the next issue of the Bancroft Banner. Getting around the city during Super Bowl LII

The City of Minneapolis is in the midst of extensive planning to ensure public safety and provide residents and visitors with a world-class event experience around Super Bowl LII. There will be a range of events in the city to enjoy during the 10-day festival Jan. 26–Feb. 4 including Super Bowl LIVE on Nicollet Mall, a free 10-day festival leading up to game day featuring free live concerts, food and other activities for local residents and their families to enjoy.

The Minnesota Super Bowl Host Committee, along with the City, Metro Transit and the Mall of America, announced the "Know Before You Go" initiative that provides travel tips and information for residents and visitors to make travel plans during the 10-day Super Bowl festival. The guide includes recommended routes to downtown Minneapolis, user-friendly maps with information about road closures, public transportation options and instructions on how to purchase convenient parking.

Various street segments have already began closing. The areas affected will be concentrated around Nicollet Mall, the convention center, and U.S. Bank Stadium. Throughout the 10-day event, Metro Transit will be the best way to reach downtown Minneapolis with expanded schedules on key routes for local commuters and additional schedules for Super Bowl related events. With the exception of game day, METRO light rail service will continue to, from, and through downtown Minneapolis. Beginning at 6 p.m. Friday, Feb. 2, through game day, trains will

not stop at U.S. Bank Stadium Station but will serve all other stops.

On the day of the Super Bowl LII game, Sunday, Feb. 4, due to security around the stadium and the proximity of the stadium to service for the light rail lines, the METRO Blue Line will be replaced with free buses, and Green Line service from Stadium Village to Target Field will be replaced with free buses. Replacement buses will begin at 4 a.m. Feb. 4 and run throughout the day, into the next morning, even as METRO light rail service resumes following crowds thinning out post game. The "Know Before You Go" resource is available to the public at mnsuperbowl.com/transportation. The site's landing page will be updated continuously in the remaining weeks leading up to Super Bowl LII.

STEP-UP offers paid summer internships for youth



STEP-UP is the City of Minneapolis internship program for young adults ages 14-21. Each year, STEP-UP recruits, trains and places more than 1,600 Minneapolis youth in meaningful paid internships with over 220 top Twin Cities businesses, public agencies and nonprofits.

As one of the country's premiere youth employment programs, STEP-UP serves youth who face some of the greatest barriers to employment, particularly youth from low income families, youth of color, youth from immigrant families, and youth with disabilities. Since it started in 2003,

STEP-UP has created nearly 27,000 meaningful internships for youth, helping young people to gain 21st-century skills, build professional connections, explore career interests and begin the path to educational and career success. Youth complete a competitive application process and work readiness training to be considered for a position with one of over 230 participating businesses in both public and private sector.

Minneapolis youth, ages 14-21, who want to change their life with professional skills training, great onthe-job experience and connections with adult professionals are encouraged to sign up for the STEP-UP program. Bloomington Ave. property sold to land trust

You may have noticed that the house at 3825 Bloomington was vacant for quite some time. Recently, it was sold to the City of Lakes Community Land Trust (CLCLT), who demolished the dilapidated structure this past fall. The CLCLT will build a new single-family home with a detached garage.

CLCLT provides permanently affordable housing by retaining ownership of the land but selling the home on the land to an income-qualified buyer. The homeowner then leases the land through a 99-year, renewable ground lease. The ground lease connects the homeowner to the community and to keeping the house permanently affordable, which facilitates the initial investment made in the home by public and private subsidy sources remaining with the home to make it affordable to subsequent, income-qualified buyers. Community garden plots

BNA oversees the community garden located at Bethel Lutheran Church on 16th Avenue and 40th Street.
