# Staying warm and saving energy this fall

s the weather turns a little chilly and we begin to think about covering our plants before the first frost, it may also be the first time that some of us are turning on our heating systems for the season. This is a great time to get yourself set for comfort and savings this winter with a Home Energy Squad Enhanced visit.

Here are a few tips to get you started:

- Have your heating system cleaned and tuned by a certified HVAC contractor.
- Program your thermostat to help you save energy while gone from the house and sleeping.
- Close the damper on your fireplace to stop a super highway for heat. If you're having trouble getting the damper shut look into an affordable chimney balloon or pillow.
- Insulate your drafty windows with shrink wrap. Window insulation kits are inexpensive and easy to install, and will make a great difference in your comfort this winter.

• Schedule a Home Energy Squad Enhanced visit to learn more about how your home is using energy and get some great energy saving products installed.

Currently Home Energy Squad visits are free for Minneapolis residents with a combined household income under \$94,300. If your household income exceeds this amount, the Bancroft Neighborhood Association will put \$50 toward your visit. ## Remembering Ruth and Dorothy Kincaid

Ruth and Dorothy Kincaid were lifelong Bancroft residents who contributed greatly to our neighborhood for many years. They grew up in a house across the street from Bancroft School. They had modest jobs as clerical workers, but gave richly to support their community.

Dorothy passed on but Ruth volunteered at Bancroft for years, tutoring kids and helping in classrooms, and, as a former Bancroft staffer said, "she went wherever she was needed." Ruth even volunteered during cancer treatments, leaving chemotherapy and going directly to the school to work with the kids. She made sure there was a library in every classroom, donating books and funds to buy books. She was described as "a faithful volunteer." A teacher remembered that Ruth loved to listen to the school's taiko drummers practice on the playground on their drums made of old tires. After she died, Bancroft School learned that she had also bequeathed money to the school. Until the new addition, there was a bench honoring Ruth under the huge elm tree behind the school.

Ruth was a good neighbor too, and was very involved in the neighborhood board, organizing and serving on the very first board. She was involved in many activities to bring the neighborhood together, and also remembered BNA in her will. Our neighborhood dinner on November 12 is sponsored in part through the Kincaids' generous giving to BNA. We are grateful for this family's support over many years.

### **Security Rebate Program**

The Security Rebate Program still has funds left to help Bancroft residents make security-related improvements to their properties. The program will reimburse up to \$50 per household for improvements such as exterior motion lights, replacing deadbolts on exterior doors, replacing window locks, and even offsetting the cost of installing a security system (however, funds cannot cover monthly fees). The program information can be found on our website and Facebook pages. While there is a list of eligible and ineligible improvements, the list is not exhaustive. If you are unsure if your improvement will be covered, contact the BNA office prior to making the improvement.
